[1] No more than two courses in one discipline may be used to satisfy Flexible Core requirements.
[2] These are variable topics courses, where each section treats a special topic. Pre-requisite: You must have achieved 60 credits and declared your major. Integration Courses: LEH 351: Studies in Science \& Applied Perspective, LEH 352: Studies in Literature, LEH 353: Studies in the Arts, LEH 355: Studies in Philosophy, Theory \& Abstract Thinking \{LEH 354: Studies in Historical Studies is NOT a College Option for this Major\}.
[3] Two of the 300-level courses (6 Credits) required for the History Major must be Research Intensive. Each semester, certain courses (HIA, HIE, HIU, HIS or HIW) are designated as Research Intensive. On CUNYfirst, the topic in the course would specify if the course is research intensive
[4] The following courses would be taken in the Middle/High School Education Minor: ESC 301, ESC 302, ESC 429, ESC 434 and ESC 476
[5] For the Social Studies Teacher Certification, the following additional courses would be taken: ESC 463, ESC 433, ESC 467, ESC 470 and ESC 471 (ESC 470 and ESC 471 must be taken together).

If students decide they no longer wish to pursue Social Studies Teacher Certification, they must redeclare the History major ( 36 credits), taking one more 300 -level HIS/HIW course and one 300 -level elective (HIA, HIE, HIU, HIS, or HIW), in lieu of the 6 credits of student teaching (ESC 470 \& ESC 471).

NOTE: Writing Intensive Sections: Complete 4 sections designated as writing-intensive, 3 prior to earning 60 credits and 1 following. These sections may be searched by class attribute and are offered in General Education, major, minor and elective courses.
