#### NYSCA/NYFA Artist Fellowship

The NYSCA/NYFA Artist Fellowship is a \$7,000 unrestricted cash grant available to artists living in New York State and/or one of the Indian Nations located therein. <u>Click</u> <u>Here for more information</u>

Jane Walker by Johnnie Walker will be funding 15 groundbreaking women-owned businesses through the end of the year. Each recipient will receive a \$10K grant plus a one-year IFundWomen Annual Coaching Membership. Applications are being accepted on a rolling basis through October 2021. Business must be owned at least 50% by a self-identified woman, generate a minimum of \$25K in annual revenue and have a product/service in one of the following categories: Entertainment & Film, Music, Journalism, Sports, STEM and Hospitality.

#### WomensNet Amber Grant

WomensNet gives away at least \$10,000 every month in Amber Grant money. They've now added an Annual \$25,000 Amber Grant as well as marketing and \$2000 mini grants. <u>See the full list here</u>.

New York's <u>Shared Work Program</u> lets companies keep trained staff and avoid layoffs. Employees can receive partial Unemployment Insurance benefits while working reduced hours. Full-time, part-time and seasonal employees are eligible.
