The **New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant Program** provides grants to New York small businesses, micro-businesses and for-profit independent arts and cultural organizations.

Jane Walker by Johnnie Walker will be funding 15 groundbreaking women-owned businesses through the end of the year. Each recipient will receive a \$10K grant plus a one-year IFundWomen Annual Coaching Membership. Applications are being accepted on a rolling basis through October 2021. Business must be owned at least 50% by a self-identified woman, generate a minimum of \$25K in annual revenue and have a product/service in one of the following categories: Entertainment & Film, Music, Journalism, Sports, STEM and Hospitality.

For restaurants, the state offers

Restaurant Resiliency Program grants for restaurants that choose to provide meals and food to people within distressed or under-represented communities. There is also a Restaurant Return-to-Work Tax Credit to help bring restaurant staff back-to-work, and to increase hiring at NYS restaurants.

General Funding

SBA loans: many lenders are re-energizing traditional loan programs, including microloans, 7A (typical business loans) and 504 loans (for property and equipment).

Brooklyn Alliance Capital is offering grants for purchase of PPE and zerointerest Bring Back Brooklyn Loans of up to \$10,000.
