

Up to \$25,000 in New York State tax credits available for costs incurred to comply with COVID-19 safety guidelines Empire State Development recently announced the COVID-19 Capital Costs Tax Credit Program, providing up to \$25,000 in tax credits to eligible businesses that spent money to comply with emergency orders and regulations, or to increase public safety in response to COVID-19. # **Information About Funding**Federal and State Programs

For restaurants, the state offers
Restaurant Resiliency Program grants
for restaurants that choose to provide
meals and food to people within distressed
or under-represented communities.
There is also a Restaurant Return-toWork Tax Credit to help bring restaurant
staff back-to-work, and to increase hiring at
NYS restaurants.

The Empire State Development website offers Grants, Tax Credits, and Technical Assistance Programs for Businesses Affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Business Pandemic Recovery Initiative.

technology, real estate, legal and accounting services, procurement opportunities, marketing, sources of loans and grants, and more.

**CitizensNYC** offers grants of up to \$10,000 in Neighborhood Business Grants, which prioritize businesses owned by people of color, immigrants, and women.

The <u>Bronx Overall Economic</u>
<u>Development Corp (BOEDC)</u> is offering zero-interest, 2-year Business Continuity Loans of \$25-100K.

**SBA loans**: many lenders are reenergizing traditional loan programs, including microloans, 7A (typical business loans) and 504 loans (for property and equipment).

**Brooklyn Alliance Capital** is offering grants for purchase of PPE and zero-interest **Bring Back Brooklyn Loans** of up to \$10,000.
