Federal and State Programs

The New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant Program provides grants to New York small businesses, micro-businesses and for-profit independent arts and cultural organizations. Grants must be used for Covid-19 related expenses incurred between March 1, 2020 and April 1, 2021. Applications due by January 2022.

The **New York Forward Loan Fund** offers low-interest loans to NY businesses with 50 or fewer employees

For restaurants, the state offers Restaurant Resiliency Program grants for restaurants that choose to provide meals and food to people within distressed or underlooking for ways to get your name out in your community. Why not do that on a national shopping day devoted to small businesses—aka Small Business Saturday (SBS)? More information

PPP Loan Forgiveness

NY State and City Programs

New York's <u>Shared Work Program</u> lets companies keep trained staff and avoid layoffs. Employees can receive partial Unemployment Insurance benefits while working reduced hours. Full-time, part-time and seasonal employees are eligible.
