Information About Funding (cont'ed)

The New York State COVID-19 Pandemic Small Business Recovery Grant Program provides grants to New York small businesses, micro-businesses and for-profit independent arts and cultural organizations.

Grants must be used for Covid-19 related expenses incurred between March 1, 2020 and April 1, 2021. **Applications due by January 2022.**

The **New York Forward Loan Fund** offers low-interest loans to NY businesses with 50 or fewer employees

General Funding

Information About Funding Federal and State Programs

For restaurants, the state offers Restaurant Resiliency Program grants for restaurants that choose to provide meals and food to people within distressed or under-represented communities. There is also a Restaurant Return-to-Work Tax Credit to help bring restaurant staff back-to-work, and to increase hiring at NYS restaurants. up to \$10,000.
