staff back-to-work, and to increase hiring at

Information About Funding Federal and State Programs

The Empire State Development website offers Grants, Tax Credits, and Technical Assistance Programs for Businesses Affected by the COVID-19 Pandemic. The Business Pandemic Recovery Initiative

eligible small businesses with specialists to provide assistance in technology, real estate, legal and accounting services, procurement opportunities, marketing, sources of loans and grants, and more.

<u>WE Legal</u>, provides women entrepreneurs a range of support and services that target negotiation and legal protection.

General Funding

CitizensNYC offers grants of up to \$10,000 in Neighborhood Business Grants, which prioritize businesses owned by people of color, immigrants, and women.

The <u>Bronx Overall Economic</u>
<u>Development Corp (BOEDC)</u> is offering zero-interest, 2-year Business Continuity Loans of \$25-100K.

SBA loans: many lenders are re-energizing traditional loan programs, including microloans, 7A (typical business loans) and 504 loans (for property and equipment).

Brooklyn Alliance Capital is offering grants for purchase of PPE and zero-interest **Bring Back Brooklyn Loans** of up to \$10,000.

<u>Loan and Grant Program</u>
