In addition, Human Service A.A. holders will be deemed to have met all lower level division general education requirements at Lehman College. Students must complete one course designated as writing intensive after transferring to Lehman that may be chosen from among major, minor, upper-division general education or elective courses. The only general education courses the BCC graduates will be required to take at Lehman College will be:

LEH 300: The Humanities	(3 credits); and,
LEH 301: The American Experience	(3 credits).

Students will also have to meet the New York State 90 credit liberal arts requirement for a B.A. degree at Lehman. Social Work majors are exempt from the College's requirement of a minor.

Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

Bronx Community College faculty, Barbara Somerville, and Lehman faculty, Norma Phillips, will review the implementation of the agreement during each Fall and Spring registration period to ensure that students are adequately informed of the program and to identify issues requiring attention.

Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

After transfer into the Lehman Social Work Program, the performance of Bronx Community College students will be monitored using the CUNY Institutional Research Data Base. Additionally, these students will be surveyed after graduation from Lehman to determine educational and occupational experience and success.

The Lehman College Social Work Program provides advisement to all students applying to the Program. Files, including the Application to the Social Work Program and transcripts, are maintained for all students admitted, and all students receive ongoing advisement. During the junior year the advisor is the Social Work Practice (SWK 311 and 312) instructor, and during the senior year the advisor is the Fieldwork Seminar (SWK 440 and 441) instructor. Students attending Lehman College under this agreement will be tracked by Norma Phillips, Social Work Program Director, who will maintain a separate file for participating students, including semester transcripts and on going notes related to advisement. Additionally, she will record their work and graduate school status for two years following graduation and analyze the progress of the group.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

The AA in Liberal Arts with the Human Service option will be publicized on the BCC college through the college catalog, on the BCC website, and in brochures to be distributed in classes and posted in appropriate places on campus.

Social work faculty will visit Bronx Community College Liberal Arts and Sciences several times during each Spring semester to present the Lehman Social Work Program to classes of graduating Human Services Option students. Special presentations will be arranged for classes of students in this AA program. While the Program has a flyer giving general information about requirements, a special flyer will be developed for students eligible to participate under this program, specifying the course requirements at BxCC and the program at Lehman. Additionally, students in the AA program will be invited to attend Lehman Open House programs and tour the campus. All Lehman social work faculty provide advisement to students applying to the Program, and they, as well as transfer advisers in other offices at Lehman, will be familiar with the special aspects of this agreement. The curriculum under this agreement will be placed on the Lehman College Website and entered into the Lehman college catalog.
